### ***Important notes about club stewardship:***

- Single memberships do not include club rights for children.
- Each "working" membership" is required to complete 25 work hours and attend 6 of 12 monthly meetings per membership year (May 1 through April 30).
  - Membership dues, required work hours and meeting requirements are prorated for those joining throughout the year.
  - Contact a club officer or committee chairperson to inquire about current work opportunities.
  - Family member work hours contribute to the overall work hours completed, i.e., father and daughter each complete 1 hour cutting brush equals 2 club work hours.
  - Five of the twenty-five work hours, at a minimum, must be at or in preparation for, the Labor Day weekend Safari Shoot which is the club's main fund raiser.
  - "Short" work hours are assessed a \$14 per hour fee upon membership renewal.
  - Hours worked can be recorded in the "Work Hour Log" located on the counter in the dining area.
- Newsletters sent via email contain important information, rule changes, and updates.
- New targets on the indoor range are available for a nominal fee.
- Please maintain our facilities by turning off all lights and fans, cleaning up any trash, closing the range doors and locking exterior doors upon departing.
